How to Approach Jazz Ballad Playing?

1. MELODY

- > Learn the melody, enjoy it, don't start off adding anything extra.
- > Pay attention to the slower tempo internalize it.
- > If the tune has lyrics, learn them!

2. DON'T APPROACH IT THE SAME WAY YOU WOULD OTHER STYLES

- > Build musical lines from the melody.
- > is it melodic, tasteful, does it ADD to the melody?
- > Embellishments should be informed by and support the melody.

3. <u>S P A C E</u> is A GOOD THING

- > You don't need to fill up every empty space by play a million notes.
- > Allow time for your musical phrases to settle/breath.
- > Develop ideas organically.

4. SUBDIVIDE OVER THE CHORUSES

- > Experiment playing solos choruses with only
 - Quarters, 8th notes, triples and 16th notes

5. LISTEN

- > As with all music, the answers lie with the masters on the recordings. This step is not to be skipped or taken lightly.
- > "Imitation, assimilation, innovation" Clark Terry
